Dear Parents and Guardians,

On behalf of the Governing Body, I bring to you our report for the academic year 2021/2022. We hope you will find it informative and that it gives you a greater understanding of the work of the Governing Body and the activities of the school.

Following Section 94 of the School Standards and Organisations (Wales) Act 2013, parents can request up to 3 meetings in a school year with their school governing body. This replaces the previous requirement for a governing body to hold an annual parents meeting.

As a governing body we welcome meeting with our school community and starting in the new year we will be hosting termly parent's meetings.

The Governing Body

Ysgol Gymraeg Rhyd-y-Grug's Governing Body is involved with the school at every level. This includes finance, safeguarding, premises management and staff appointments. As Governors, we consider our most important role to be the safety, welfare and education of our pupils.

In accordance with the Government's requirements for all Governing Bodies, the three strategic functions of a Governing Body are:

Ensuring clarity of vision, ethos and strategic direction.

Holding the Head teacher to account for the educational performance of the school and its pupils. Monitoring the financial performance of the school and making sure its money is well spent.

Governors are appointed to ensure that objectives are met, and that future planning is both visionary and realistic. We provide strategic direction for the improvement of the school; monitor and evaluate the effectiveness of the school; and hold the school to account for the standards achieved and the quality of education. We are here to support and encourage our Headteacher, Senior Leadership Team and all school staff to ensure that every one of our children has access to an enriched education and to all the opportunities that they deserve.

Curriculum Statement

There are four purposes at the heart of the curriculum at Ysgol Gymraeg Rhyd y Grug, that support the children to be:-

- ethical, informed citizens of Wales and the world;
- healthy, confident individuals, ready to lead fulfilling lives as valued members of society.

Our aim is to provide the highest quality care and education in a happy, caring, active and safe environment to enable all children, whatever their ability, to achieve their potential. Emphasis is placed on learning the basic skills of literacy and numeracy and the importance of making them relevant and meaningful to the child. It is important to make the children aware of their environment, their community, their country and the world.

By using a teaching and learning method which is based on themes, the structure of our curriculum contains six Areas of Learning and Experience. Each one of these Areas of Learning and Experience make distinct and strong contributions to developing the four purposes of the curriculum. Together, they define the breadth of the curriculum. The wealth of educational experiences form an integral part of the curriculum, to broaden the children's horizons, stimulate their imagination and promote enjoyment in learning.

The six Areas of Learning and Experience are:-

- Expressive arts;
- Health and well-being;
- Humanities;
- Languages, literacy and communication;
- Mathematics and numeracy;
- Science and technology.

Security, Health and Safety

Security and the safety of our pupils is a priority to us at Ysgol Rhyd y Grug. We aim to make pupils feel safe, comfortable and happy at school.

Within the school site there are a limited number of entry and exit points which are all locked once the school day has begun. After this time, entry must be verified by a member of staff. All entry points are monitored by CCTV.

All visitors to the school must report to Reception, where they are required to sign in (and out) via our electronic system. Visitors are given a visitor's badge for recognition by staff and pupils in the school during their visit. A number of staff hold a First Aid at Work Certificate and there is a rota in place to ensure there is always someone available if needed. There is a designated first aid point at a central location in the school which holds first aid resources and equipment.

The school has a comprehensive Health and Safety policy, which is followed to provide a safe school environment for everyone.

How we making sure every child gets teaching to meet their individual needs?

As a school we wish to continue to build on high standards through rich learning experiences. The school identifies and supports children with Additional Needs including More Able & Talented children and follows the ALN Act. Progress is carefully monitored and tracked, interventions are in place and if external support is thought necessary, this is sought. The school has a close working relationship with parents/carers as they are kept informed and involved. Pupil voice is an integral part of this process. Teaching Assistants reinforce and support learning effectively within the classrooms, working with groups and/or individuals depending on the needs identified. Teachers assess all pupils' learning both formally and informally and targets are discussed and regularly reviewed with pupils. Minority and underachieving groups are supported, and their progress is specifically tracked so that they attain their potential.

What activities are available for our students?

There is a range of activities available to pupils over and above the Curriculum. We are always seeking to improve and enrich our provision to develop children's enthusiasm for learning. This includes the use of and development of ICT skills across the curriculum. Visits out and visitors in are widely used to enhance the learning, and to support the curriculum and to make learning relevant to our children. This includes linking with our local and wider community.

The school provides a range of sporting and extracurricular activities and children are consulted about choices of after school clubs. Some of those which are offered include: Urdd club, football, netball, dance, choir and gardening club.

Thank you to the PTA who this year donated funds for pupils' celebrations and towards the school's messaging service.

The summer Fayre was held raising £2189.62. Various other events are being organised including discos for the pupils and a Christmas Fayre with a raffle.
